Retention of Undergraduate Students Fall 2009 to Fall 2010

Executive Summary

This report tracks the enrollment patterns of undergraduate students enrolled in the Fall 2009 term. Using the Banner system, students were classified as enrolled, withdrawn, or graduated for Fall 2010. Those classified as graduated received their degrees in Fall 2009, Spring 2010, or Summer 2010. The tables that follow look at four different (but overlapping) cohorts of students: all undergraduates, new freshmen, new freshmen who were provisionally admitted, and new transfer students.

The overall retention rate for undergraduates who did not graduate dropped almost six percent, to 68.4%. While the drop in retention was most evident among students with lower academic qualifications, nearly every category of student saw a decrease in retention. For new freshmen, the retention rate is down almost ten percent from last year's rate of 72.3%, to 62.6%. The decrease is concentrated in students with lower test scores (less than 1100 SAT), but students with higher scores are down as well. The retention rate for provisional admits dropped significantly, from just under 56% to 41.9%; this had a significant impact on the overall retention rate due to the fact that provisionals made up 15.5% of the freshman class in Fall 2009, up from 6.4% in Fall 2008. The retention rate for new transfers dropped only slightly, from 56.0% to 54.9%. The retention rates for students classified as Juniors and Seniors were essentially unchanged after adjusting for graduates. Freshmen

Of the 2,306 undergraduate students enrolled in Fall 2009:

294 (12.7%) graduated in December 2009, May 2010, or August 2010

636 (27.6%) did not return for Fall 2010

1,376 (59.7%) reenrolled for Fall 2010

After adjusting for graduates, the undergraduate retention rate was 68.4%. See Section 1, page 3, for more details.

Compared to the Fall 2008 to Fall 2009 retention rates, retention was down for nearly every category of student: male/female, minority/non-minority, test score bands (although the higher bands saw less of a drop than the lower bands), classification, high school quartile, etc. Out-of-state students retained slightly better from Fall 2009 to Fall 2010 than they did the previous year, by about 1.7%.

Of the 554 new freshmen enrolled in Fall 2009:

207 (37.4%) did not return for Fall 2010

347 (62.6%) reenrolled for Fall 2009

The retention rate for new freshmen was 62.6%. See Section 2, page 7 for more details.

As with all undergraduates, the retention of new freshmen was down for almost every category as compared to the Fall 2008 to Fall 2009 rates. The retention rate for males decreased more than the rate for females. In terms of test scores, students with an SAT score between 1100 and 1190 had a slightly increased retention rate (up one percent), but the rest of the test score bands had lower rates, including students with 1200 and above SATs. In terms of academic index, students in Level 2 had a slightly higher retention rate (up 1.5%), but the other levels, including Level 1, showed lower retention rates than the previous year.

Of the 86 new provisionally admitted students in Fall 2009:

50 (58.1%) did not return for Fall 2010

36 (41.9%) reenrolled for Fall 2010

The retention rate for new provisionally admitted students was 41.9%. See Section 3, page 11 for more details.

Comparison of retention rates for provisional admits is somewhat problematic due to the large increase in provisionals for Fall 2009. Overall, the retention rate for provisionals dropped from 55.6% to 41.9% while the number of provisionals rose from 36 in Fall 2008 to 86 in Fall 2009. Provisionals with SAT scores between 900 and 990 actually showed a six percent increase in retention rate. Provisionals with an academic index in Level 4 had a worse retention rate the6e.
